# 2021 Village Council Election April 13, 2021

The Miami Shores Village Council Election will take place on Tuesday, April 13, 2021. All Village registered voters may vote-by-mail 0r in person at the C. Lawton McCall Community Center located at 9617 Park Drive. Polls will be open from 7 AM to 7 PM. There will be no early voting.

There are four candidates running for three Council seats. The top vote getter is traditionally appointed Mayor and will serve a two-year term as Mayor followed by another two years as a Council Member. The candidate receiving the second highest number of votes traditionally is appointed as the Vice Mayor for two years followed by another two as a Council Member. The candidate with the third hightest vote count will serve two years on the Council.

#### The 2021 Village Council will be sworn in on Tuesday, April 20, 2021 at 6:30 PM. (Location TBD)



If you are presently registered to vote in Miami-Dade County and need to request a VBM ballot, you may request a VBM ballot online, by email, fax, phone or mail. Miami-Dade County voters may choose to receive a VBM ballot for a specific election, or for all elections in which they are eligible to vote through the end of the second regularly scheduled general election. Please note if you selected a 2-year request for VBM ballots, your ballot will be automatically sent to you for the 2021 Miami Shores Village Council Election.

Additionally, you may present, in person at the Elections Department, a picture identification with a signature, or authorize a designee to pick up the VBM ballot on the day prior to Election Day.

#### A VOTER MUST FIRST BE REGISTERED TO VOTE BEFORE HE OR SHE CAN REQUEST A VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT (VBM).

### **DEADLINE TO REQUEST VBM:**

The deadline to request a vote by mail ballot is 5 PM on the 10th day before the election, April 3, 2021 for the Miami Shores Village Council Election.





#### AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

The April 2021 meetings will be held at 6:30 PM on Tuesday, April 6th and April 20th in the 9900 NE 2nd Avenue Building, Miami Shores, FL 33138.

#### **RECENT COUNCIL ACTION**

- Approved the 2021 Election Board (Poll worker list).

- Adopted an ordinance, establishing irrigation/water conservation measures in accordance with the South Florida Water Management District's Chapter 40E-24, Florida Administrative Code.

- Appointed John Bachay to the Historic Preservation Board.

- Approved a resolution, urging the Florida Legislature to strengthen consumer protection measures to Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Programs; to expand the qualifying improvements that may be financed through pace programs to include conversion from septic tanks to sewer systems and other sewage treatment improvements.

- Directed the Village Manager to work with the Army Corps of Engineers to find suitable alternatives to the Back Bay Study Plan.
